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## **MULLAVILLY IS A COMMUNITY BASED** CHURCH AND PARISH


#### 'To Know Christ and to make Him Known'



There are so many lovely old and modern hymns that remind us that the 'Church' of Christ our Lord is made

up of people from every nation under As many of you know, one of my

favourite things to do is to travel: to see other countries, experience their culture and meet some of their people, even if only for a few hours or a couple of days. I am always fascinated with what I find; from the huge, great, big, busy cities to the remote, quiet, desolate places. One thing I also look out for in all the places I go is a Christian Church. On the odd occasion these have been hard to find and I may not have been able to locate one, but if I can, we always go in and, if there is no service on, have a look around, sit quietly and pray and thank God for that church and its witness in that place, and also for those at home.



Places where worshippers have walked

for miles to be there to meet others: places where the church 'building' could be easily hidden among the skyscrapers around it and few attend but is still a presence in that place.

The Church for many is a building. Four walls. A pulpit. A prayer desk. A Communion Table. Some pews. A Baptism Font. Maybe some stain glass windows. A Lectern with a Bible on it. Choir Stalls.

Yes, this is a place for the Church to meet. It is not the building that is 'the church', but the people of God who meet together 'as the church'. The early church, which we read about in the Book of Acts, met together in people's homes and shared with each other all that they had. In one country I went to with CMSI, the 'Church' met under a tree. It didn't make it any less of 'a church'. The people still worshipped God, prayed and shared in the Lords Supper together.

Many of you hold Mullavilly Church building very dear to your hearts and rightly so, it is a beautiful old building that many have said to me is homely and welcoming. But as 'the Church' of Mullavilly, in this community, what do you hold dear? Is it just the building, the seat you always sit in, the windows you like to look at, the prayer book you use, the hymnbook you like to sing

out of or the Bible that is very rarely lifted and used that remains stacked at the end of your pew. Or, is it the people that makes 'church' special to you? Is it because you come primarily to worship God along with others? Is the thing you hold dearest of all your own personal relationship with the Lord? If all the physical things were stripped away, would you still feel part of 'a church'?

A thought for discussion... Would it matter where you met together, so long as you were able to read God's Word, sing hymns, prayer and have fellowship together?

Yes, we love 'our church, the people', we love the place we call 'God's house' in this parish. As part of the local community of Mullavilly, Laurelvale and the surrounding area, our hope and desire is that we would 'All Know Christ and make Him Known, and in doing so provide and meet the needs of all those who live here. As you know, you are more than welcome to join us at any of our various Church services each week, but not only that, to join in all our activities and events, or avail of our organisations, which cater for all ages on a weekly or monthly basis.



#### **Confirmation Class and Junior Bible Class**

Parents, please ask your young person to read this information. Thank you It is important to note that all young people intending to be confirmed next year should be attending Bible Class every Sunday morning. At present the class is following the church teaching programme on The Armour of God but will soon be switching to the Confirmation Preparation Programme.

Full attendance at Bible Class is mandatory for confirmation, and unless there is an exceptional reason why your young person cannot attend, due to sickness for example, this may impact on them being put forward for Confirmation in this particular year group. There have been around 10 Sundays since the beginning of Junior Bible Class this year, and the most that any one candidate has attended has been 5.

Part of Confirmation, taking this next step in their faith journey, is their commitment to church attendance and meeting together with others to worship God.

One of the Promises that was made by you the Parents / God-Parents at their baptism was; 'Will you care for them and help them to take their place within the life and worship of Christ's Church?' to which you would have replied – 'with the help of God, we will.' At their Confirmation, they will be taking on this and other promises for themselves, therefore we need to be able to see that they are serious and committed to these promises and that they are not undertaking them lightly. Can we please ask that as you as parents, continue to set an example to your young person by attending church with them and ensuring that they come to Junior Bible Class for all the teaching and preparation that is required. Sadly, as we look around our church, as is the same in other churches, we hear the phrase, 'Confirmation is just a passing-out parade'. This makes me, as it does many ministers, very sad indeed. In fact, it is the complete opposite. This is an opportunity for those being confirmed to make a positive commitment to become full members of the church – not to see it as the time to walk away.

Please have this discussion with your young people at home. Talk about it and find out from them why they want to be confirmed.

Would you not agree that our church should be filled with young people, if they were serious about the promises they made at their confirmations over the years? Which leaves the questions, where are they? What did their confirmation mean to them? I guess that for many, they still need the guidance and encouragement of their parents to bring them to church and to get involved in the life and faith of the Christian Community of Mullavilly Parish (as one of the other promises indicates). Many, many thanks for your help in this very important step in your young person's journey of faith, and if you have any queries or questions please do not hesitate to get in touch with the Rector.

#### **Foodbank**



## A Call to Ordination Parish Reader - Lay Reader

Have you ever felt that God may be calling you to some kind of ministry within the church? Perhaps at a local level as a Parish Reader, like Margaret or Caroline who help me week by week on a rota basis. Or perhaps at a diocesan level as a Lay Reader, or even in the wider church as an ordained minister. If this is something you would like to discuss further, please speak to me and we can have a chat about the different possibilities.

As is very evident in our parish, we have some very dedicated ladies who fulfil very important roles. (e.g. two Parish Readers, the organist, the parish secretary, parish treasurer and many others who are on our scripture reading list, although we do have a number of men on this as well), and as leaders of our children's and adult organisations.

I am therefore challenging the men of our parish to think and pray seriously about what God may be calling you to do. It may be something like taking on the responsibility of our Friendship Group or helping with the sound desk in Church, Kids Club or Youth Club or starting a 'Men's Shed' group that would help to keep the area round our church and graveyard tidy, or do little bits of maintenance, or painting or 'hands-on' stuff..! The options are limitless, but we need more willing hands. You might think that you have nothing to offer, but what you do have is the ability to be a male role model to the young men of our church and parish.



#### **Apple Blossom Baby Basics**

Since our last update in the previous magazine, there has been a lot of hard work 'devoted to setting up our Baby Basics. The room we use is shelved and filled with storage boxes and lots of people have been very generous in providing all sorts of items from baby wash to Moses baskets. Some have taken items home to wash, iron and return. Others have been sorting and sifting the items that have been donated. Some who have knitting skills or sewing skills have been putting these to good use in making things to go in the baskets.

Our committee have been working very hard too, setting up the room, applying for grants, filling in copious amounts of paperwork and keeping in regular contact with the health professionals and other bodies, as well as collecting items that have been and are being donated.



We have already prepared and sent out our first basket, which was very gratefully received.

Information and articles about Baby Basics have appeared in the Church of Ireland Gazette (an all-Ireland publication) and The Ambassador (the Armagh Diocesan Magazine), as well as letters and leaflets going into primary schools and junior high schools in the area, some of whom have already held a collection to provide additional items. The Rector has spoken at the Diocesan Synod to all the clergy and representatives of the Diocese; at the Mothers Union Rural Deanery Service, which was held in Ballymoyer, and also the Armagh Diocesan Council Meeting for MU, where there was a lot of interest in the project. We have also made close contacts with some charity shops, where they will let us know if there are Moses baskets that we could use. We can forward items to them that we receive but cannot use. The amazing thing about this project so far is how it is impacting all ages, across all organisations and groups. From small children in our schools, to older folk who are knitting, many are keen to help in whatever way they can.

We will continue to keep you up-to-date on all that is happening – but please do follow us on Facebook if you wish, and in doing so, you will be able to hear our latest news and whether we have special requests for particular items that may be needed.

Again, many thanks to all who have helped so far and who are continuing to offer their help in any way. If you feel this may be something you would be interested in getting involved with then please do get in touch. The more the merrier and it means that the little tasks can then be shared out as and when needed.

There is also a requirement for those who are parish pastoral visitors to receive SGT training, especially those calling on vulnerable adults. #### **News from the Diocese and Wider Church**



At our Diocesan Synod, the Archbishop announced that he would be retiring on 2nd February 2020. Archbishop Richard came to Armagh in December 2012 and has been warmly welcomed into our Parish and also into some of our homes when he came to visit us.

We have always enjoyed his visits, his down-to-earth manner and his ability to get along with all ages.

The Archbishop said; "I must thank you and others throughout the Church of Ireland who have made these past seven years - for me at least - both fulfilling and pleasurable. Of course, not every moment of every day has been without issues or problems to be faced, but this time in Armagh has truly been a very agreeable experience for me, and for this I humbly thank God for the great privilege I was given in being appointed as Primate seven years ago and I also thank all of you, for your constant encouragement, your friendship, your prayers, your support and... your patience."

We pray for God's blessing on him as he leaves this demanding role and moves into retirement and live in West Cork and that he will have health and strength for many years to come. We pray also for those who are tasked with the responsibility of choosing and electing a new Archbishop, not just for Armagh but also as Primate of all Ireland.

#### **Congratulations!**



Archdeacon Andrew Forster has been appointed as the new Bishop of Derry and Raphoe. Andrew (52), along with his wife Heather, who have three children, succeeds Ken Good who retired at the end of May this year. Andrew led a special 'Parish Away Day' for us a couple of years ago and we were very blessed to have him on that occasion. We pray for him as he prepares for this new and demanding role.

Andrew has been Rector of Drumglass (Dungannon), since 2007, and Archdeacon since 2015. He was previously Rector of Drumcliffe and Archdeacon of Elphin and Ardagh in the Diocese of Kilmore, Elphin and Ardagh (2002-2007), Church of Ireland Chaplain and Dean of Residence at Queen's University, Belfast (1995-2002), and Curate in Willowfield Parish Church, Belfast, in the Diocese of Down and Dromore (1992-1995).

Andrew's Consecration as Bishop will take place in Armagh Cathedral on Sunday 8th December and the Archbishop has invited all the Armagh Clergy to this important service as we gather to support Andrew on this special occasion. As a result, there will be no evening service in Mullavilly Church on the 8th December.
